- 1. Grad Decorator, Photographer and Caterer have be rebooked for September 26<sup>th</sup>. What this day will look like is unknown at the moment with all the uncertainty, however there will be something for the 2020 Grad Class on this day. Continue to plan banquet dinner and dance in the field house after ceremony.
- 2. Facebook Page, Not all grads and parents are on this page and information is being missed by some families. Pat will continue to post on page but send information to the school for distribution as well. Des Nolan will be sending out an email regarding grad information in the next few days, he will let people know about the page and ask them to please join.
- 3. Grad 2020 set up of banquet and clean up Sunday. It was decided since we will not be spending all of the monies initially intended for this year's ceremony that we would ask the Class of 2021 to set up for the banquet on Saturday and then come back on the Sunday to clean up. This is a great way for them to start fundraising for their Grad.
- 4. We cancelled the extra chairs from the city so we are saving \$2929.50 minus a 5% cancellation fee of \$146.48. (Des Nolan will be calling to speak to company about the 5%) The Multiplex has 498 grey chairs and 152 Black chairs (Black chairs for the stage) EPC has 200 folding black chairs that maybe used.

Dear Grade 12 students and families,

Aspen View Public Schools is extremely proud of the hard work done by this year's Grade 12 students to achieve their high school graduation, and we are all saddened and disappointed that the COVID-19 pandemic forced the cancellation of graduation ceremonies scheduled for this spring. Graduation is an important accomplishment for students, families and educators alike, and deserving of appropriate recognition.

Each high school within Aspen View will be setting a new date for graduation ceremonies to be held in the Fall of 2020. We are hopeful that the COVID-19 pandemic will be sufficiently resolved to allow each school to plan a graduation celebration that they feel is appropriate; however, all graduation events will still be contingent upon, and respect any restrictions in place from the Chief Medical Officer of Health in regard to social distancing and large gatherings.

School administrators, in collaboration with graduation committees, will plan for graduation events in the Fall of 2020 that include, at minimum:

- Commencement ceremonies (presentation of diplomas/certificates)
- Formal presentations and speeches
- Light refreshments such as coffee, juice, appetizers, etc.

Again, these events are contingent upon and must respect any restrictions in place from the Chief Medical Officer of Health. As such, attendance at these events may be limited. I have advised that once schools have determined a new date for the graduation events described above, that these events not be postponed further.

I have directed school administrators to continue working with student grad committees and parent groups to <u>tentatively</u> plan, if desired, additional graduation celebrations, such as dances, banquets, etc. However, I must stress that planning of this nature should be done with extreme caution, as no event will be allowed to take place that contravenes any restrictions regarding social distancing and large gatherings.

Again, we remain hopeful that the COVID-19 pandemic will be sufficiently resolved to allow each graduation ceremony to proceed as originally planned. It is our great desire to see our graduating Grade 12 students enjoy the celebration they have worked hard to earn. However, Aspen View Public School has an obligation to protect the health and safety of students, families, staff and the general public; and respect any restrictions that may be in place.



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We appreciate your cooperation as we navigate a very uncertain and rapidly evolving situation. More specific information regarding your child's Fall 2020 graduation events will be forthcoming from your child's school.
