201 Richard Wiselka Memorial Award

This award shall be presented annually to a graduating grade 12 student at Edwin Parr Composite School who has exemplified consistent academic achievement, participation in school and community sports, and other extra-curricular activities.

The award shall consist of a personal plaque with the student's name engraved and a cheque in the amount of \$150.00. The student's name shall also be engraved on the plaque which is displayed in the school.

Students must apply for this award to the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee.

Selection of the award winner will be made by the Edwin Parr composite School Awards Committee, in consultation with other staff members.

Application must be received at the school by Friday, April 5, 2019.

202 F.N.M.I. Student Education Award

This award shall be presented annually to a graduating Grade 12 student at Edwin Parr Composite School who exemplifies a spirit of determination, perseverance, and years of commitment in achieving the graduation requirements.

The award will be given to the graduate who has also been involved in extra-curricular activities at school and in the community and has been recognized for their personal achievements.

The award shall consist of a cheque in the amount of \$250.00. The student name shall be engraved on a plaque, which will be displayed in the school.

Students must apply for this award to the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee.

Selection of the award winner will be made by the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee.

Application must be received at the school by Friday, April 5, 2019.

203 Lions' Legacy Scholarship

This award shall be presented annually to a graduating Grade 12 student at Edwin Parr Composite School who volunteers in the Athabasca community.

The award shall consist of a cheque in the amount of \$1,000.00

Students must apply for this award to the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee.

Students must submit letters of reference (maximum of 2) with a summary of their character, leadership roles within the school, involvement in extra-curricular activities at school, involvement in organizations in the community at large, work experiences and special interest/hobbies.

Selection of the award winner will be made by the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee.

Application must be received at the school by Friday, April 5, 2019.

205 Hal Harrison Memorial Journalism/English Award

This award shall be presented annually a graduating Grade 12 student of Edwin Parr Composite School who is enrolled in the fields of Journalism or English.

The award will be based on the student's English 30 marks and their involvement in related extra-curricular activities, such as the school newspaper.

The award shall consist of a cheque in the amount of \$200.00. The award is sponsored by the Athabasca Advocate.

Students must apply for this award to the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee. Students must provide proof of registration into an English or Journalism program at the post-secondary level.

Selection of the award winner will be made by the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee.

This award will be presented at the EPC Fall Awards Night.

Application must be received at the school by Friday, April 5, 2019.

206 Athabasca Chapter of the MS Society of Canada Award

This award shall be presented annually to a graduating Grade 12 student of Edwin Parr Composite School who has shown excellence in the field of Science.

The award will be presented to the student with the highest average in any two of the following courses:

208 Athabasca District Agricultural Society Annual Scholarship

This award shall be presented annually to a graduating Grade 12 student of Edwin Parr Composite School who has achieved excellence and is continuing study in a post-secondary institution or apprenticeship program.

The recipient of the award must be a member of a farm family, i.e. parents living and working the farm in the County of Athabasca No.12 (grain, cattle, mixed)

The award shall consist of a cheque in the amount of \$1500.00.

Students must apply for this award to the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee. Application must include the land description, description of farming operations, years in business, 4-H involvement or any other agriculture related activities. Students must provide proof of acceptance into a post secondary institution or apprenticeship program.

Selection of the award winner will be made by the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee, in consultation with the Athabasca Agricultural Society committee.

If more than one student applies, consideration will be given to citizenship (school, 4-H, community) and diligence.

Application must be received at the school by Friday, April 5, 2019.

209 Jordan St. Louis Memorial R.A.P. Award

This award shall be presented annually to a graduating Grade 12 student of Edwin Parr Composite School who has successfully completed the R.A.P. Program; exemplifies good citizenship; and has an overall average above 65%.

This award shall consist of a cheque in the amount of \$100.00 and a personal plaque. This award is sponsored by the 2003 Graduation Class.

Students must apply for this award to the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee. A letter of reference from the employer must accompany the application. Other letters of reference can also accompany the application. For example, letters from relevant educators and civic organizations.

Selection of the award winner will be made by the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee.

210 Athabasca Oilmen's Scholarship

This award shall be presented annually to a graduating Grade 12 of Edwin Parr Composite School who is pursuing post-secondary studies in Natural Resources (Petroleum Engineering, Geology, etc) who has an average above 70% in at least 4 core subjects.

This award shall consist of a cheque in the amount of \$1,000.00.

Students must apply for this award to the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee. Students must provide proof of post-secondary acceptance.

Selection of the award winner will be made by the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee in consultation with the Athabasca Oilmen's Association.

Application must be received at the school by Friday, April 5, 2019.

The bursaries shall consist of a cheque in the amount of \$500.00 for each recipient.

Students must apply for this award to the Royal Canadian Legion in Athabasca, including proof of enrollment in a post-secondary institution or apprenticeship.

Selection of the award winners will be made by the Royal Canadian Legion, in consultation with the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee.

Application must be forwarded by the student as soon as available, but no later than April 5, 2019.

214 Athabasca Health Care Auxiliary Association Scholarship

This award which will be presented annually to a graduating Grade 12 student of Edwin Parr Composite School who:

- 1 is diligent in their studies and has a 70% or higher overall average in Grade 12
- 2. is proceeding (within the next 12 months) to post-secondary education in any aspect of the health care profession

The award shall consist of a cheque for \$1000.00.

Students need to apply for this award. The application should include a Grade 12 transcript, an indication of registration in post-secondary training in the health care profession, a short essay stating the value of the award to the applicant and provide information on any volunteer time spent in health care.

Selection of the award winner will be made by the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards committee.

Application must be received at the school by Friday, April 5, 2019.

215 Royal Canadian Legion Ladies' Auxiliary Bursary

This bursary is presented to a graduating grade 12 student entering their **first term** of a certificate/diploma or degree in a University, School of Technology and Art, Nursing Program, or any recognized College in Alberta and the North West Territories.

The award is intended to assist children of current serving personnel and ex-serving personnel.

Students applying for this bursary may apply in the year they graduate, or they may wait for one year, if so wish, before furthering their education.

219 Karl Hetze - Capital Power Genesee Employees Memorial Award

This award will be presented annually to two (2) graduating Grade 12 students at Edwin Parr Composite School who are enrolled in a Engineering program on a full time basis. Program enrolment must for a term of 1 year or more, require full time attendance at a Post Secondary Institution, and lead to a certificate or diploma in Engineering.

The award shall consist of a cheque in the amount of \$250 for each recipient. Recipients will be selected by the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards committee on the basis of financial need and commitment to their peers, community and learning.

Students must apply for this award to the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee and applications must be accompanied by proof of registration in the Engineering program.

Application must be received at the school by Friday, April 5, 2019.

220 Rod Winder Memorial First Responder Scholarship

The criteria for this award is as follows:

- 1. This Scholarship will have a value of \$1000 per year.
- 2. Only students in the County of Athabasca will be eligible to apply.
- 3. The following are what we recommend to be used for judging criteria (in order of priority):
 - Applicants must be pursuing and admitted into an education facility for Fire, Ambulance, (EMT/Paramedic) and Police Service.
 - Applicants must have contributed as a volunteer in their community and must provide letters of support for their "Volunteer" service hours.
 - Applicants must write a 250 to 500 word essay to explain why they would like to enter this field of work.
 - Applicants High School Marks can be used to judge applicants if there is a tie.

221 Les Wood Memorial Scholarship

This award shall be presented annually to a graduating Grade 12 of Edwin Parr Composite School that is either pursuing post-secondary studies (diploma or baccalaureate) OR beginning their career in Athabasca.

This award shall consist of a cheque in the amount of \$1000.00.

Students must apply for this award to the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee. Students must provide proof of post-secondary acceptance and a 250 word essay describing how the funds for the award would be used. In addition, the award application form must also be completed.

Alternatively, if a student is not going to post-secondary, a 500 word essay must be submitted describing how the student would be positively contributing to the Athabasca community if they are not pursuing post-secondary studies. In addition, the award application form must also be completed.

Selection of the award winner will be made by the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee in consultation with Travis Guay who will confer with Connie Wood.

Application must be received at the school by Friday, April 5, 2019.

222 Dr. Peter Karczmarczyk Scholarship

This award shall be presented annually to a graduating Grade 12 student of Edwin Parr Composite School who has shown excellence in Chemistry.

The award will be presented to the student with the highest mark in Chemistry 30, and is enrolled in a Post-Secondary Institution.

The award will consist of a cheque in the amount of \$300.00

Students need to apply for this award. The student must submit proof of registration in a Post-Secondary Institution to Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee.

Selection of the award winner will be made by the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee.

This award will be presented at the EPC Fall Awards Night.

Application must be received at the school by Friday, April 5, 2019.

223 Charles Sequeira Memorial Scholarship

Charles Sequeira was a lawyer in India before becoming an educator at Edwin Parr Composite School. He believed strongly in social justice and speaking up for those who cannot speak for themselves.

This award shall be presented annually to a graduating Grade 12 student at Edwin Parr Composite School who demonstrates interest in and a passion for social justice causes. Other criteria may include academic proficiency, school or community volunteer activities, intended post-secondary studies and financial need.

The award shall consist of a cheque in the amount of \$1,000.

Students must apply for this award to the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee and include proof of registration into any post-secondary education institution.

Students must also include a short (roughly 250 word) essay with their application, explaining why the student feels that they best meet the criteria for this award. This essay should include information regarding the student's involvement in school and community activities and how these activities tie into their own personal sense of social justice.

Selection of the award winner will be made by the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee in consultation with Mrs. Rita Sequeira.

The financial need of all the prospective candidates will be considered but financial need will not be the sole determining factor in who receives the scholarship.
