Purpose: Alberta-Pacific Forest Industries Inc. values the importance of education and continued learning. The **Al-Pac Trades Education Award** is designed to encourage young Albertans to pursue further educational opportunities in apprenticeship programs.

Value: Each year, one EPC Athabasca student may receive a single \$500 award.

Eligibility: Applicants from **EPC Athabasca** must be pursuing studies leading to an apprenticeship recognized in the Pulp and Paper Industry: Electrical, Instrumentation, Heavy Equipment Operator/Technician, Mechanical, Millwright, Power Engineering, Steamfitter/Pipefitter, Welder.

Selection Process: Staff from **EPC Athabasca** will make up the selection committee. The committee will review all applications and will determine the successful applicant based on a satisfactory performance in:

- academics;
- leadership capabilities and skills;
- community involvement

Application Process: Al-Pac's funding deadline is June 30; however, the **EPC Athabasca** Selection Committee may implement an earlier date. Completed applications must be submitted to the **EPC Athabasca** Student Services department.

Award Presentation: When possible, a representative from Alberta-Pacific will present the \$500 award at the graduation ceremonies. When not possible, an **EPC Athabasca** staff member is asked to present on Al-Pac's behalf.
