204 Hal Harrison Memorial Journalism/English Award

The award will be based on the student's English 30 marks and their involvement in related extracurricular activities, such as the school newspaper.

This award shall be presented annually to a graduating Grade 12 student of Edwin Parr Composite School who has achieved excellence and is continuing study in a post-secondary institution or apprenticeship program.

The recipient of the award must be a member of a farm family, i.e. parents living and working the farm in the County of Athabasca No.12 (grain, cattle, mixed)

The award shall consist of a cheque in the amount of \$1500.00.

Students must apply for this award to the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee. Application must include a short write up that includes the legal land description, description of farming operations, years in business, 4-H involvement or any other agriculture related activities. Students must provide proof of acceptance into a post-secondary institution or apprenticeship program.

Selection of the award winner will be made by the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee, in consultation with the Athabasca Agricultural Society committee.

If more than one student applies, consideration will be given to citizenship (school, 4-H, community) and diligence.

208 PTW Electrical/Instrumentation Starter Scholarship

This award shall be presented annually to 1 graduating grade 12 student who is pursuing a career in either the Electrical or Instrumentation trade (award cannot be shared). This award shall consist of a starter set of tools valued at approximately \$1500 in order to assist the student in beginning their training/career in the Electrical or Instrumentation trade.

Students applying to this award must:

- have been accepted into a 2-3 Year Instrumentation CET program (NAIT, SAIT, Sask Poly, etc.), be an indentured apprentice in either Electrical or Instrumentation, or be a current E/I RAP student.
- Have a satisfactory academic record and standing
- Demonstrate good attendance
- Demonstrate excellent behavior

Preference will be given to students who are current PTW employees or have completed a successful RAP/Work Experience placement with PTW.

Students must provide proof of acceptance to a post-secondary institution if using that as part of their application for this award.

Students must apply for this award to the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee.

Selection of the award winner will be made by the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee on the basis of the above criteria.

215 Karl Hetze- Capital Power Genesee Employees Memorial Award

This award will be presented annually to two graduating grade 12 students at Edwin Parr Composite School who excel in math (30-1 or 30-2 level) and science courses (30 level). Recipients must be enrolled full time at the post-secondary level and priority will be given to students entering an Engineering program (including Power, Electrical, Instrumentation, Petroleum, Mechanical or similar technology). Students enrolled full time in a Renewable Resources / Environmental Services program (including Conservation, Forestry, Alternative Energy, Water/Wastewater Management or similar technology) may also be eligible."

The award shall consist of a cheque in the amount of \$250 for each recipient. Recipients will be selected by the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards committee on the basis of financial need and commitment to their peers, community and learning.

Students must apply for this award to the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee and applications must be accompanied by proof of registration in the Engineering program.

Application must be received at the school by Tuesday, April 18, 2023.

216 Rod Winder Memorial First Responder Scholarship

The criteria for this award is as follows:

- 1. This Scholarship will have a value of \$1000 per year.
- 2. Only students in the County of Athabasca will be eligible to apply.
- 3. The following are what we recommend to be used for judging criteria (in order of priority):
 - Applicants must be pursuing and admitted into an education facility for Fire, Ambulance, (EMT/Paramedic) and Police Service.
 - Applicants must have contributed as a volunteer in their community and must provide letters of support for their "Volunteer" service hours.
 - Applicants must write a 250 to 500 word essay to explain why they would like to enter this field of work.
 - Applicants' High School Marks can be used to judge applicants if there is a tie.

217 Fortress Construction: Construction Technology Scholarship

This award shall be presented annually to a graduating grade 12 student at Edwin Parr Composite School who has completed a minimum of three 3000 level modules in Construction Technology. Priority will be given to a student who is planning to go into Carpentry, or a related trade. Students must show a willingness to learn and demonstrate an aptitude for working with materials, tools and equipment. If several candidates are worthy of the award it may be split into smaller equal amounts.

The award shall consist of a cheque in the amount of \$1500.00.

Students must apply for this award to the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee.

Selection of the award winner will be made by the Edwin Parr composite School Awards Committee, in consultation with the Construction teacher.

Application must be received at the school by Tuesday, April 18, 2023.

218 Dr. Peter Karczmarczyk Scholarship

This award shall be presented annually to a graduating Grade 12 student of Edwin Parr Composite School who has shown excellence in Chemistry.

The award will be presented to the student with the highest mark in Chemistry 30, and is enrolled in a Post- Secondary Institution.

The award will consist of a cheque in the amount of \$300.00

219 Charles Sequeira Memorial Scholarship

Charles Sequeira was a lawyer in India before becoming an educator at Edwin Parr Composite School. He believed strongly in social justice and speaking up for those who cannot speak for themselves.

This award shall be presented annually to a graduating Grade 12 student at Edwin Parr Composite School who demonstrates an interest in and a passion for social justice causes. Other criteria may include academic proficiency, school or community volunteer activities, intended post-secondary studies and financial need.

The award shall consist of a cheque in the amount of \$1,000.

Students must apply for this award to the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee and include proof of registration into any post-secondary education institution.

Students must also include a short (roughly 250 word) essay with their application, explaining why the student feels that they best meet the criteria for this award. This essay should include information regarding the student's involvement in school and community activities and how these activities tie into their own personal sense of social justice.

Selection of the award winner will be made by the Edwin Parr Composite School Awards Committee in consultation with Mrs. Rita Sequeira.

The financial need of all the prospective candidates will be considered but financial need will not be the sole determining factor in who receives the scholarship.

Transcripts:

EPC Grade 12 Applicants must attach an official copy of their Grade 11 and 12 transcripts to the application form.

In case of an applicant(s) accepted into Medical and/or Dental School, he/she must attach official transcripts from the accredited academic institution the applicant is currently attending or has attended. Transcripts must include information for at least three (3) consecutive terms.

Enrolment:

Applicants must provide proof of enrolment at a post-secondary institution for the corresponding school year if selected as the recipient.

Essay Questions:

Achievements: In essay format, describe any personal achievements and/or accomplishments you think the Scholarship Committee should know about in assessing your application. Based on the eligibility requirements for this scholarship, explain your financial needs and why do you feel you should be the recipient of Dr. J. M. Brown's Memorial Scholarship. Section 6 SELECTION PROCESS AND CRITERIA

The Scholarship Committee will select three (3) members not affiliated with any of the applicant(s) to form a Selection Committee. Committee members will review each application and its attached materials on a point basis. The selection committee may choose to interview some or all applicants. Total points from the Selection Committee members will be averaged to determine an applicant's ranking in the evaluation process. Final selection of the winner will be based on the ranking averages.

Selection will be made by evaluating each application on a 100 point scale:

- 40 points academic performance based on official transcripts from high school or currently attended accredited College or University.
- o 10 points extra-curricular activities and community involvements including work ethic and leadership abilities.
- 20 points personal essay.
- o 15 points academic recommendation(s) as stated in letters of reference.
- 15 points overall impression based on the interview.

NOTIFICATION:

Notification letters will be mailed to all applicants, including the recipient of the scholarship award by May 30th of the corresponding year.
