PERSONAL MOBILE DEVICES AND SOCIAL MEDIA PROCEDURE

Background

New and future technologies create opportunities for many constructive and positive uses that can aid the instructional process. However, unregulated use of personal mobile devices in schools can be a source of distraction that can negatively impact students' and teachers' mental health, engagement, work and learning. Staff and students are entitled to welcoming, caring, respectful and safe learning environments that respect diversity and nurture a sense of belonging and a positive sense of self, and the unregulated use of personal mobile devices poses risks which can compromise this environment.

Definitions

'Personal mobile device' means any personal electronic device that can be used to communicate with or access the internet, such as a cellphone, tablet, laptop, smartwatch or other devices that can be tethered to a personal mobile device and gaming systems.

'Social media' refers to websites and applications that enable users to create and share content or to participate in social networking.

Procedures General

1. Personal mobile devices are valuable electronic devices. The security and storage of these items is the sole responsibility of the owner or user. Aspen View Public Schools and Edwin Parr Composite School assumes no responsibility for the safety, security, loss, repair or replacement of personal mobile devices.

Students

2. Students may not use personal mobile devices during instructional time, which includes school-sponsored activities such as assemblies or presentations by guest speakers.

2.1. Limited use of personal mobile devices may be permitted, as determined by the principal or designate, for health or medical reasons, or to support special learning needs.

2.1.1. Exemptions for health, medical or special learning needs must be clearly detailed within the student's Medical Support Program or Individualized Program Plan.

2.2. Limited use of personal mobile devices may be permitted for educational or other purposes, as determined by the principal or designate.

2.3. During instructional time, personal mobile devices must be kept silent or powered off, and be stored in the student's locker

3. Personal mobile devices may not be taken into test or examination settings, unless students have been given permission by the principal or designate to do so.

- 4. Personal mobile devices may not be used in settings that have the potential to violate a person's reasonable expectation of privacy, such as change rooms, washrooms or private counseling rooms.
- 5. Students in Grade 7 through Grade 12 are permitted limited use of personal mobile devices, only during designated lunch breaks.
 - 5.1. Students in Grades 7 through Grade 12 may not access personal mobile devices during

class transition times, or during temporary absences from the classroom during instructional time.

- 6. Failure of students to comply shall result in:
 - 6.1. First offense: student's personal mobile device shall be confiscated and stored securely in the school office. The student's parent/guardian will be advised via phone or email by the teacher. The student will be able to retrieve the device at the end of the school day. A log entry will be made by the teacher or administrator by the end of the school day.
 - 6.2. Second offense: student's personal mobile device shall be confiscated and stored securely in the school office. The student's parent/guardian will be advised via phone or email by the teacher. The student's parent/guardian will be able to retrieve the device at the end of the school day. A log entry will be made by the teacher or administrator by the end of the school day.

6.3. Third and subsequent offense: As per section 6.2 above, plus progressive discipline as per *Administrative Procedure 355: Student Code of Conduct and Discipline*.

Social Media

7. Aspen View Public Schools' publicly accessible wireless network shall be configured so as not to allow access to social media websites and applications, as defined by the division's web filter system.


