



The grade 9's had a wonderful time at Tawatinaw Valley Ski Hill this past Tuesday! It was beautiful outside and the students had a ton of fun!











With instruction from Dr. Lawton Shaw and Carmen Allen, students performed a titration of vinegar with sodium hydroxide. They were excited to use the University's lab equipment including pH meters and magnetic stirrers. Students will use the data collected in the lab to graph titration curves, identify equivalence points, and calculate the molarity of vinegar. 
