



Reminder: Register to Ride 2025-26

All students requesting a seat on a school bus in 2025-26 need to register as soon as possible, even if ...

- they rode the bus this year
- they only need to ride the bus occasionally

Aspen View Public Schools will endeavor to accommodate bus registrations received after June 30, 2025, however, late registrations may not be eligible for transportation until September 8, 2025.

Register online through the following link: BusPlanner Workflow.

- Select Transportation Registration to register students for busing
- If the student has a second primary address (ex. Custody split between parents), a second Transportation Registration is required
- If you are requesting busing to an alternate location other than the student's primary residence(s), (ex. Child care provider) you will also need to complete an Alternate Address form.
